

Lantz Art on Display At Albany Institute

Paintings by Paul Lantz of Middleburgh are being exhibited through June 19 at the Albany Institute of History and Art.

The Schoharie County artist has been associated with Eugene Speicher, John Sloan, Randall Davey and Boardman Robinson, some of the "old timers" who made American art great in the 1920's and 1930's.

Mr. Lantz is a realist, a painter of landscapes and portraits. He has set up a studio on his farm in Miedleburgh where he plans to paint this summer.

Born in Nebraska in 1908 he studied at the Kansas City Art Institute (where he later taught) and in New York City at the National Academy of Design and Art Student's League. He is represented in the permanent collections of the Metropolitan Museum of Art and New-York Historical Society, the private collections of Mrs. Marshall Field, Cyrus McCormack Jr., Sen. Dennis Chavez of New Mex-

ico, Theodore Roosevelt Jr. and others. His work has been reproduced in many publications including Life Magazine, the New York Times, Art Digest.

During World War II Mr. Lantz sketched on the battlefield in the Pacific, Luzon, and New Guinea, creating records for the War Department, and as instruction pieces for training soldiers.
